1.3 Stimulus Material - points to note

The Stimulus material for the 1.3 exam should be available to you through your PN. Some things to note:

- The purpose of providing the sources ahead of time is to overcome literacy obstacles. You can't teach to the topic of the booklet.
- How much time ākonga get with the sources will depend on their literacy needs. For most (but not all) ākonga this might be one or two periods. You will best know the needs of your ākonga.
- As tempting as it is (so tempting!) we shoudn't be dropping hints as to what we think the likely concepts will be.
- Even though the stimlus front cover says "You may keep this booklet" the sources should stay in class. Exceptions to this general rule might occur if ākonga are away sick. The front cover printing seems to be a template. They **can** keep the booklet from the real exam.

• The video source will have a series of screenshots and some transcription in the sources they get for the exam. There is no expectation or ability to show the video during the exam.
